FOOD FOR THOUGHT: Gone Fishing

Living a few blocks from a stretch of Lake Michigan in Chicago we dubbed "the rocks" nestled between the Belmont Yacht Club and the Nike Missile Base (we're talking late '50s early '60s), it's no surprise that my brother took me fishing. Mum would wake us at dawn, feed us breakfast, pack us a lunch, and send us on our way with minnows from the bait shop or worms from the back yard. We carried bamboo poles and cheap casting rods.

My older brother was a fisherman. I was the kid brother tagging along. He would get into a zone and patiently stare out over the water never saying a word. I was hyper talking to everyone around us. By 10 o'clock I had eaten my lunch and by 11 I came back home fishless. My brother would return late afternoon, his face sunburnt red, usually carrying a stringer of perch and rock bass, which Mum would fillet and serve for dinner. It never seemed to matter to him if the fish were biting or not. Just being there was what was important to him. At no other time did he exhibit such enduring patience. Late in life he became very successful in the field of human resources. His ability to mediate issues and solve problems was exceptional. I'm guessing he learned that at the lake, pole in hand. Fishing served him well. Those who are good at fishing are patient. So are good Christians. Maybe I should have fished more.
